Care

180 people with progressive MS and other neurological illnesses and disabilities received specialized adult day services at the King Adult Day Enrichment Program (KADEP). KADEP provides a dynamic array of classes and activities, nursing care and other services designed to enhance the physical, emotional, cognitive and social wellbeing of each participant.

7,000 patient visits were conducted by Rocky Mountain MS Center physicians at four Colorado locations including the Rocky Mountain MS Center at Anschutz Medical Campus, the Rocky Mountain MS Center at Potomac Street Health Clinic, the MS Center at the VA of Denver, and the MS Center at Denver Health.

Support

180 people receive hydrotherapy from specially trained MS Center therapists in pools around the Front Range.

500 people received one-on-one education about the Social Security Benefit Insurance criteria and the application process, including assistance with obtaining additional evaluations helpful in documenting work-related difficulties.



Education

2,500 people learned about the progress being made with MS research and strategies for living with the disease at 25 free educational seminars.



5,330 people visited the newly launched LivingWell site (livingwell.mscenter.org). This site includes information about complementary and conventional MS treatments, as well as articles about symptom management and living with MS.

52,000 readers received four issues (one each quarter) of InforMS, the MS Center newsletter. This color publication is a leader amongst MS journals and is distributed internationally.

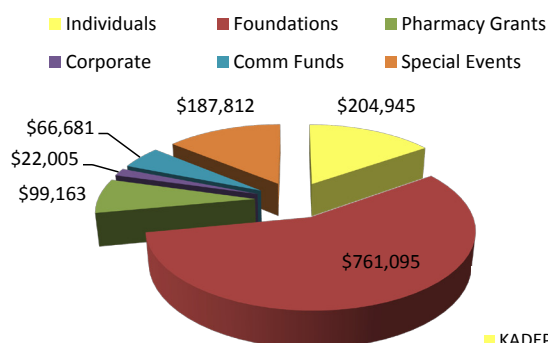
Research

415 people participated in 11 research studies, and contracts for an additional 8 studies were finalized.

50 scientific papers and presentations were shared with the health care community as a result of the research and clinical experiences of our neurological team.

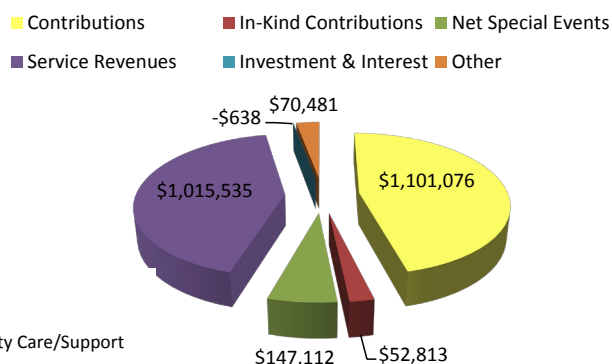

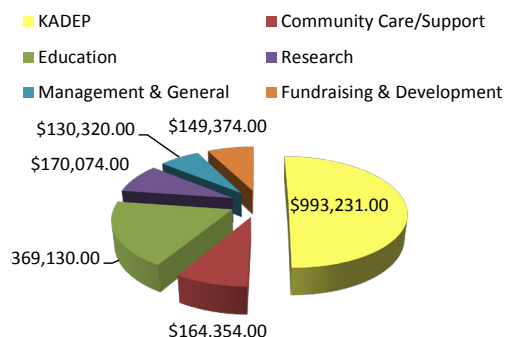
